It also comes with a media file view where you can select a file to record from. To play back the macros, the application uses Quicktime to synchronize the recorded clip with your computer's sound output. This playback is made possible through customizable shortcuts and an internal list view where you can see the status of each macro. Keyboard Shortcuts: Windows Key + Command (Ctrl) – Macro create Windows Key + Space (Tab) – Macro play SHIFT + Command (Ctrl) – Repeat last macro SHIFT + Space (Tab) – Delete last macro LIST VIEW Playback – The status of the macro is listed in a full list view which is sorted by date. Forward/Back – Skips one step in the list. Fast Forward/Reverse – Skips several steps in the list. Playback – Allows playing back a macro. Forward/Reverse – Moves forward or back in the list. Delete – Delete the selected macro. Sync – Synchronize the audio of the playback with the recorded clip. Any key – Skip to the next macro. The sync button only works when playback is stopped, and the selected macro is not in the list. CUSTOMIZATION Customize the status bar – This allows you to customize the status bar in the preferences window. Disable button – If this button is disabled, the recorded clip is not deleted when the last button is pressed. Outta Timer is a countdown timer which lets you set start times and countdowns for a group of custom timers. In other words, it helps you plan things out before you start. Start times are manually selected from a list of hours, minutes, and seconds. As time passes, you get a countdown which works with multiple continuous options. The app is equipped with a large configurable timer where you can select various presets to set the start time and countdown accordingly. Once the timer reaches zero, you hear the success sound and also get a quick reminder of the actual time remaining. The application is easy to use, just name the timer and enter the number of hours, minutes, and seconds for the countdown. Multiple custom timers are listed in a table, and hitting "start" initiates the countdown which will be available in a continuous mode or a single one. To save it, just name it and set a convenient format for the profile. You can even set up a custom alarm sound. All settings can be synchronized to Windows Calendar. This means that 5hr will start on the 1st June 2018 and the 1st June is in 6 days! I can't be more precise than this... :(Does anyone know if I can set this time as "always" so it will start the 1st June 2018 regardless of when I use it? I tried to set it but when I click it it seems not possible. This is the image: I'm not sure if it's possible to set it as "always" but what if I could get it to take a date from the database? I'm using mysql. Any help would be appreciated! Thanks posted by outta timer at 10:17 AM Thanks for the question. So, your problem seems to be that of adding a specific date to the list of timers, correct? If this is the case, you will need to change the 'always' logic to use this date instead of the current one. If you were to change the date by some few hours to say 20:00 instead of 06:00, you should be able to use it. By checking if it is after 20:00, you will be able to control whether you can add the date or not. If it is not 20:00, then you should not be able to add the date. Other than that, there's not many other options available. It's always possible to submit a support request. I would also suggest you to move to the Outta Timer forum to discuss any issues you have, as the comments section can be a little bit long, especially if you are new to the software.
